



## Daisy Beaded Bead

This beaded beads looks especially interesting when made of Matubo Nib-Bit Duets



### Material (for one bead)

Matubo Nib-Bit (16 pcs)

Matubo 8/0 (12 pcs)

15/0 Japanese seed beads (approx. 0,3 gram)

11/0 Japanese seed beads (approx. 0,2 gram)

4mm firepolished beads (12 pcs)

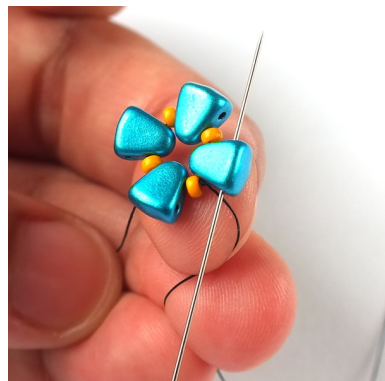
Beading needle and thread (Nymo, Fireline ...)

Difficulty: Intermediate / for beginners



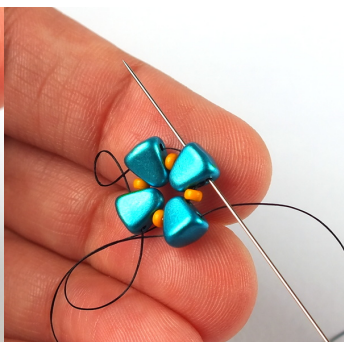
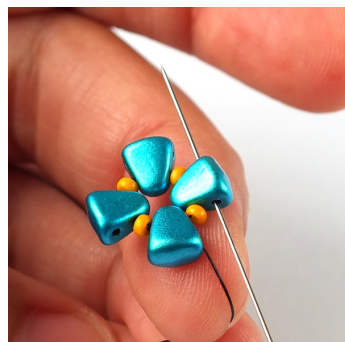


1) String one 11/0, one NB (narrow end), one 11/0, one NB (narrow end) ... total four of each.



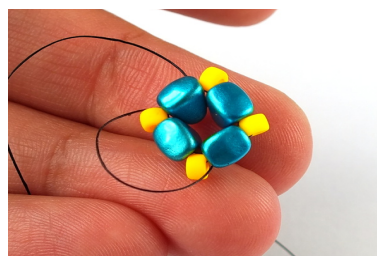
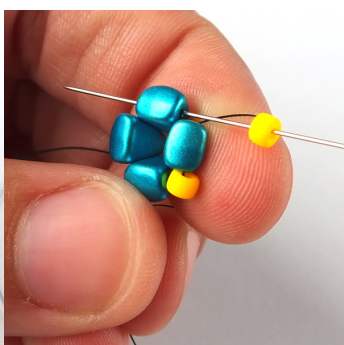
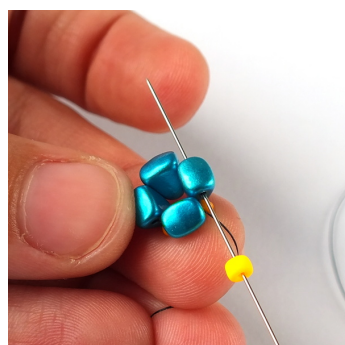
2) Slide all the beads to the end of the thread and tie a square knot to form a circle. Then pass through the upper hole (wide end) of the nearest NB bead.

3) Pass through the upper holes of all the four NB beads ...

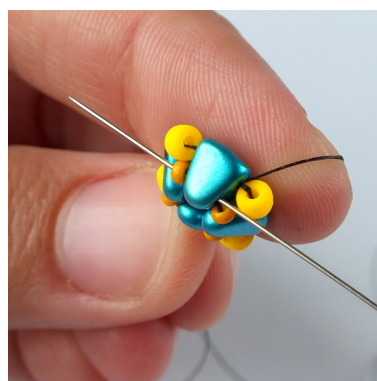


4) Pull snug.

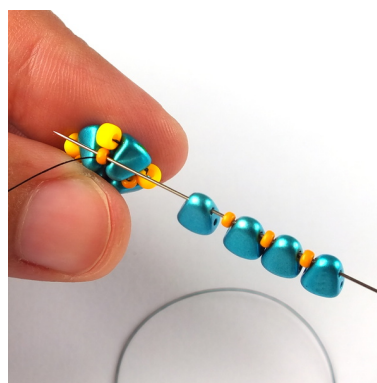
5) Add one 8/0 and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead. Repeat ...



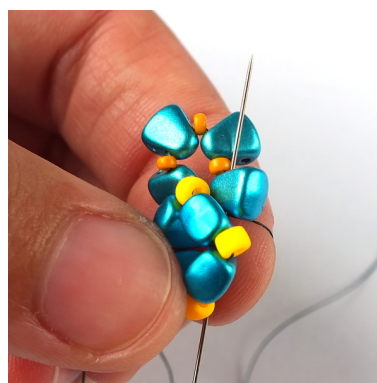
6) ... until you reach the end of the row. The first unit is finished.



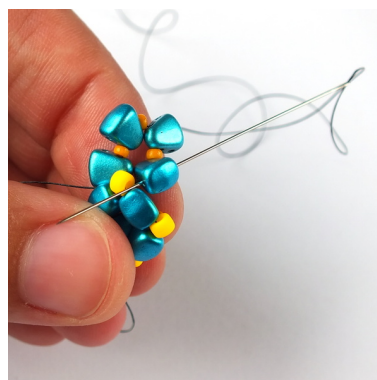
7) The thread exits from the upper hole of one of the NB beads. Pass back through the lower hole of the same NB bead and then through the next 11/0.



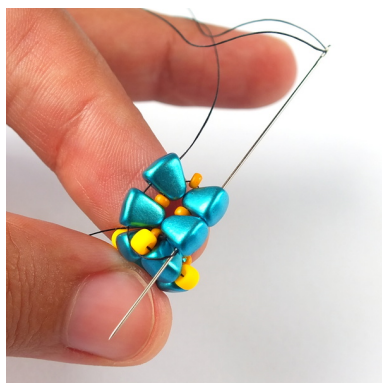
8) Add one NB (narrow end), one 11/0, one NB (narrow end), one 11/0, one NB (narrow end) and one 11/0 and then pass through the same 11/0 the thread is exiting from.



9) Pull snug. Pass through the lower hole (narrow end) of the nearest new NB bead ...

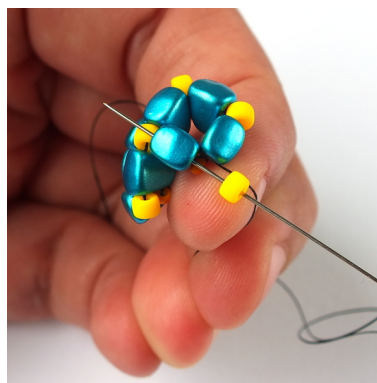


10) ... and then pass back through the upper hole of the same NB bead.

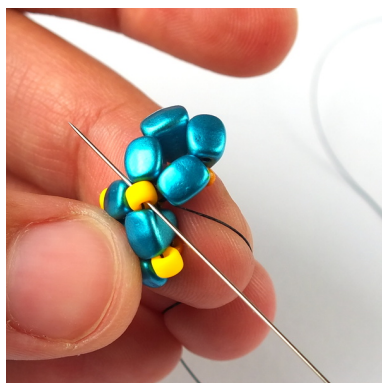


11) Weave through the upper holes of all the new NB beads.

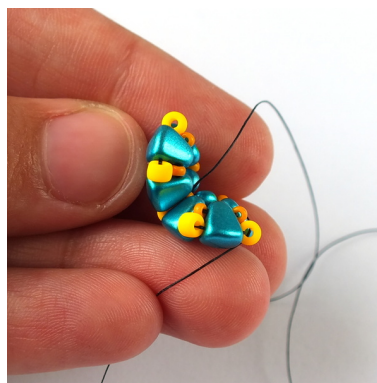
Pull snug.



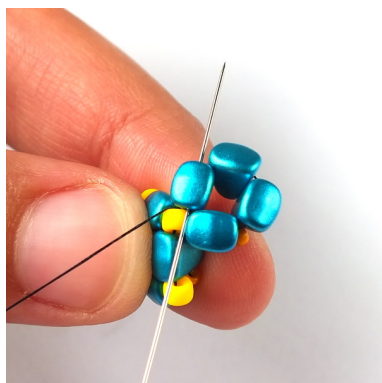
16) ... until you reach the end of the row.



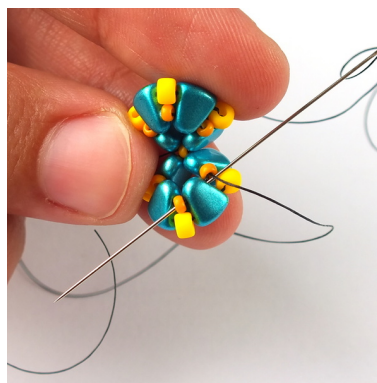
12) The thread is exiting from the same NB you started from in step 10. Pass through the nearest 8/0 from the previous "unit" ...



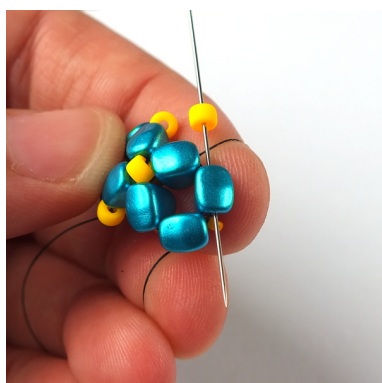
17) This is what you should get.



13) ... and then pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead.



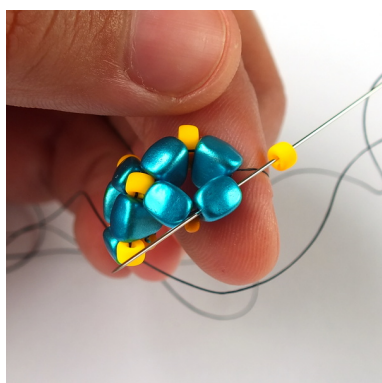
18) Weave through beads to get to one of the 11/0s (as shown in the photo).



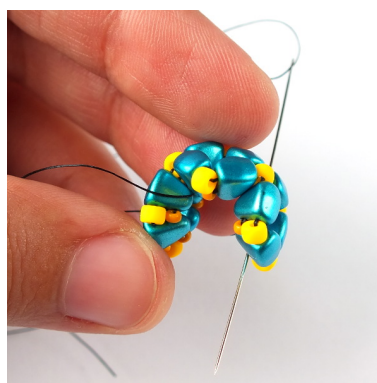
14) Add one 8/0 and pass through the upper hole of the next NB bead.



19) Add another unit by repeating steps 8 - 18.

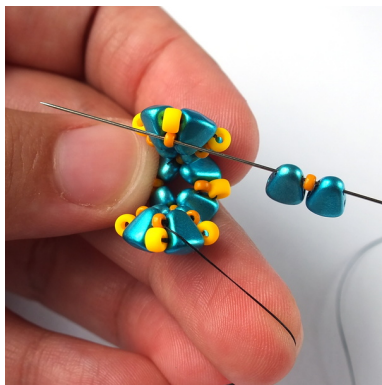


15) Repeat step 14 ...

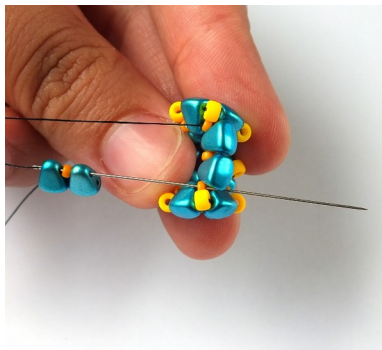


20) This is what you should get.



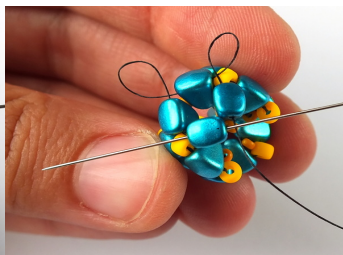
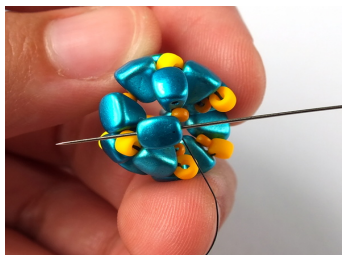


21) The thread exits from one of the 11/0s on the end of the strip. Add one NB (narrow end), one 11/0 and one NB (narrow end) and pass through the corresponding 11/0 on the other end of the strip.

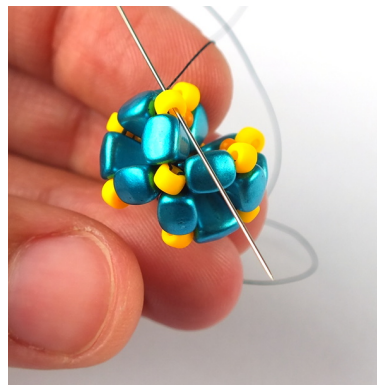
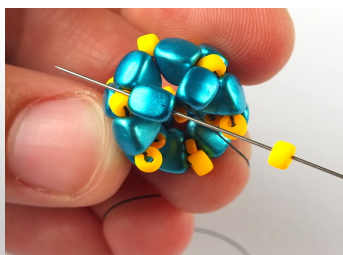
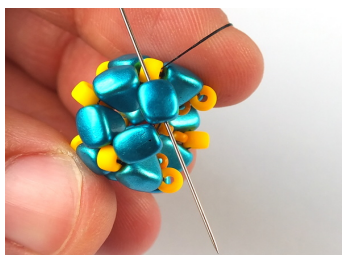
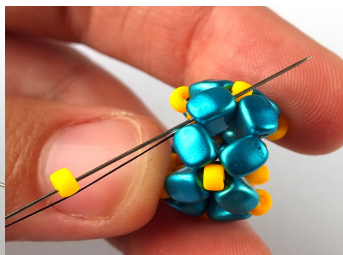
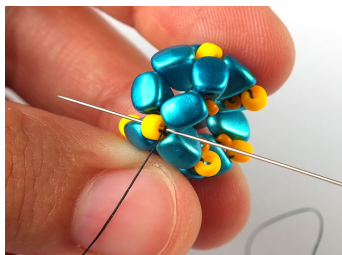


22) Add one NB (narrow end), one 11/0 and one NB (narrow end) and pass through the same 11/0 you started from in the previous step ...

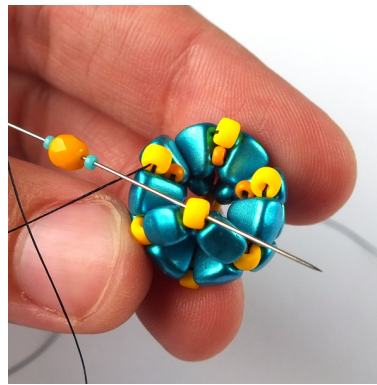
23) ... and then finish the last unit like in steps 11 – 16. First weave through all the upper holes of the four new NB beads ...



... and then weave through the same row one more time. In the corner where there already is an 8/0, pass through this 8/0 and then through the upper hole of the next NB bead. In the corner where there is no 8/0s, add one and then pass through the upper hole of the next NB.

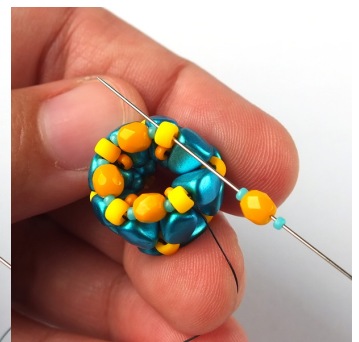
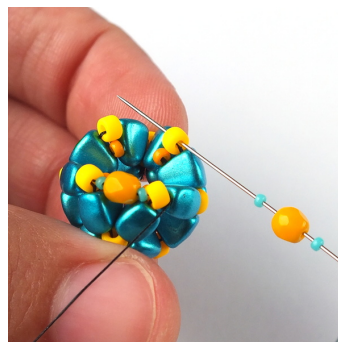


24) The basic construction of the beaded bead is finished. Weave through beads to get to one of the 8/0s on the side of the bead.

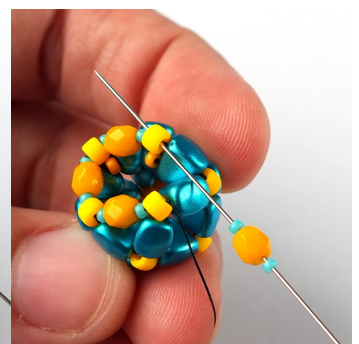
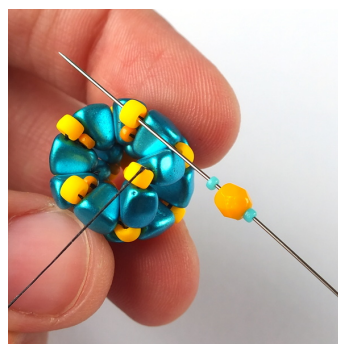


25) Add one 15/0, one 4mm FP and one 15/0 and then pass through the next 8/0 in the row.

26) Repeat step 25, until you reach the end of the row.

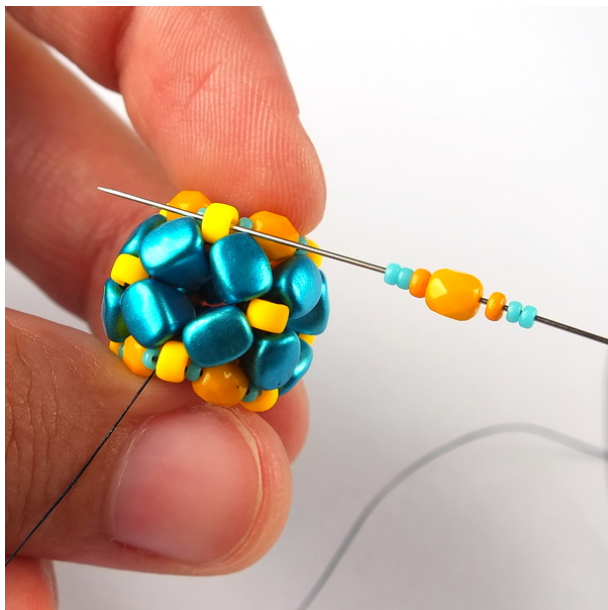


27) Weave through beads to get to the other side of the bead and repeat steps 25 – 26 there.

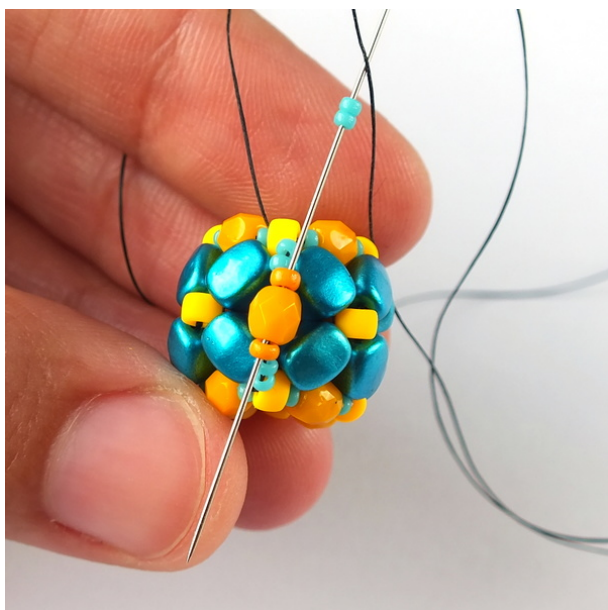




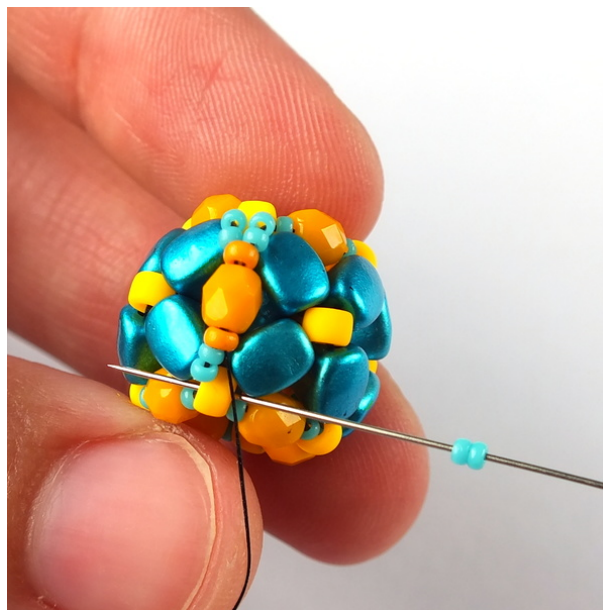
28) The thread exits from one of the 8/0s on the side of the bead. Add two 15/0s, one 11/0, one 4mm FP, one 11/0 and two 15/0s and then pass through the corresponding 8/0 on the other side of the bead.



29) Add two 15/0s and pass back through the (11/0, 4mm FP and 11/0) you just added.

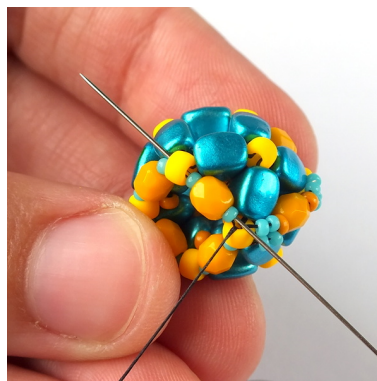


30) Add two 15/0s and pass through the same 8/0 you started from in step 28 (as shown in the photo).

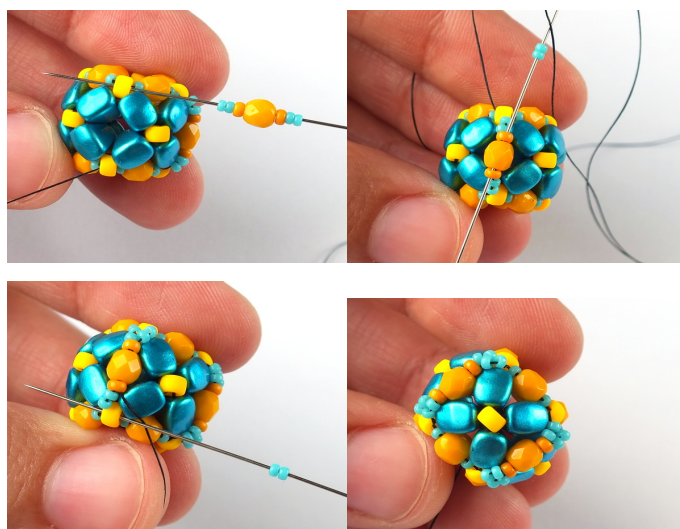


Pull snug. Make sure that all the beads sit in their place and there are no threads visible.

31) Weave through beads to get to the next 8/0 in the row.



32) Repeat steps 28 – 31, until you reach the end of the row. Tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off all the remaining thread. The bead is finished.

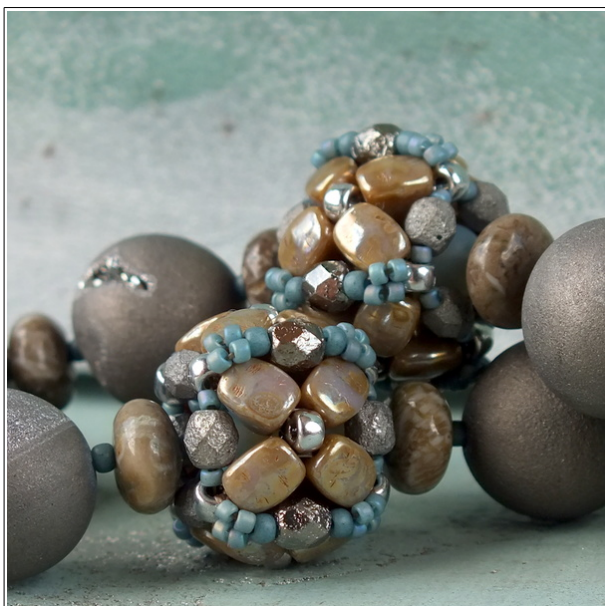

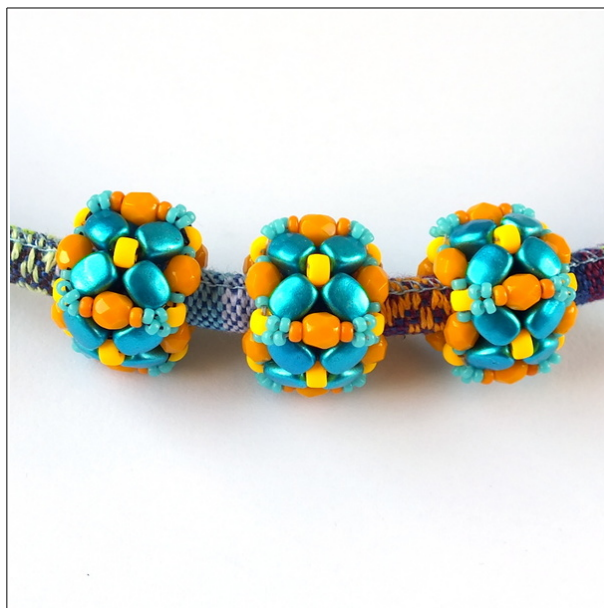
