



Wax Cord Bracelet

Use new Matubo 2/0 beads to make simple unisex jewelry



Material (for one bracelet)

Matubo 2/0 (approx. 20 - 30 pcs)

Cotton wax cord, 1mm (approx. 4-5 times longer than the desired length of the bracelet)

Button (1 pc)

Difficulty: For beginners



1) Fold the piece of wax cord in the half.. Slide the button on the cord – each end through one hole – and move the button to the middle of the cord.

2) Tie a knot just behind the button.



3) String one 2/0 bead on each end of the cord...



4) ... and slide them down to the last knot.



5) Tie another knot, just behind these two beads.



6) Repeat steps 3, 4...

7) ... and 5, until you reach the desired length of the bracelet.

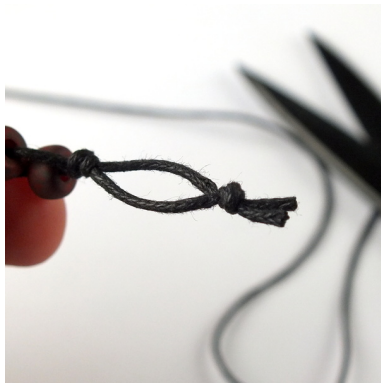


8) At the end of the bracelet make the button loop by tying yet another knot. The distance between the last two knots should be approximately the same size as the button.



9) Make sure that the loop is the right size – if it's too small, you might have trouble closing and opening the bracelet. If it's too big, the bracelet might open on it's own while being worn.





10) Fasten the knot and then cut off all the remaining cord.

11) The bracelet is finished.



Tips:

You can use two or more colors of 2/0 beads (I like to use beads in matte and glossy version of the same color).

When making the bracelet, you can also string the 2/0 bead on one end of the cord and leave the other one empty (see the red bracelet on the first "colorways" photo on this page) or you can string one bead on both ends of the cord (see the blue bracelet on the same photo).

You can easily make the bracelet adjustable by making two or three button loops at the end.

Wax cord - black
Matubo 2/0 93200/85805

Wax cord - copper
Matubo 2/0 33050/85001 and 33050/15001

Wax cord - brown
Matubo 2/0 13020/85001 and 13020/15001
